As a Tepper Semester student, you work closely with an accomplished faculty of professional artists who nurture your creative, intellectual, and personal growth. The program also guides you in understanding the business of the industry, which is essential for a rewarding and successful career in the performing arts. As an immersion experience, this professional preparatory semester creates the base of a national arts network for emerging young artists.

Residency in New York City is an integral part of the Tepper Semester. Students live and study in the heart of New York's theater district and attend studio classes on Theatre Row. The program also takes advantage of the city's vast cultural and educational resources. Students learn from exposure to a broad spectrum of world-class theaters, museums, libraries, and entertainment venues so vital to artistic training.



























WHAT MAKES THE TEPPER SEMESTER UNIQUE

- **IMMERSION** Live and study in the heart of the New York professional theater scene, taking classes at Theatre Row and other studios throughout the theater district. Attend up to 30 productions on and off Broadway that expose you to numerous genres of theater. Learn about the artistic process from professional actors, directors, and writers who attend your theater classes on a weekly basis for workshops and discussion.
- **OPPORTUNITY AND ACCESS** Learn from the best. The Tepper Semester features a faculty of prominent industry professionals. Take advantage of unprecedented opportunities to develop valuable relationships with exceptional artists in the industry. As an immersion experience, this professional preparatory semester creates the base of a national arts network for emerging artists.
- NINETEEN-CREDIT CORE CURRICULUM Build a critical understanding of the profession through daily artistic training. In addition to core classes, your curriculum is rounded out with numerous master classes (16 in the recent semester) with industry professionals, including master teachers, actors, casting directors, agents, composers, writers, designers, stage managers, and production staff members.

- INTIMATE CLASS SIZES Receive one-on-one attention in a supportive, nurturing environment that helps build confidence and focus.
- **PREPARATION** Prepare for the transition from college life to your professional career—a primary focus of the Tepper Semester. Acquire essential business skills and build professional relationships critical for success in the industry.
- ► **RICH CULTURAL EXPERIENCES** Participate in special Tepper Semester events and field trips to further your exposure to the New York City theater and entertainment community. A discussion and lunch with the artistic staff of the renowned Public Theater and discussions with the cast and creative teams of several Broadway shows are just a few examples of what students have experienced. Take weekly field trips to museums, cabarets, and dance and concert halls, and use the New York Library for the Performing Arts at Lincoln Center for theater research.
- **INTERNSHIPS** Take advantage of such internship opportunities as the Summer Play Festival (SPF), where you are exposed to every area of producing, including casting, budgeting, literary management, and much more. Opportunities for design/technical theater and stage management students include exposure to nonprofit and commercial areas of the discipline. Additionally, you may earn experience credit by working with professional designers.
- FINANCIAL AID A number of merit- and need-based grants are available for the Tepper Semester program. Students applying for the Tepper Semester should contact the Tepper Center to discuss financial aid options available to you.
- MAKING IT HAPPEN Students from all universities and colleges are invited to apply. The Tepper Semester is designed for advanced drama majors. Students who have junior status or the equivalent may apply for their senior year of study.
